

Addition To Community Gardens Enhances Mission...

Lions, Midwest Bank Team Up For Garden Shed

A 2019 collaborative effort to install a shed at the Barnesville Community Gardens was recognized the morning of Monday, August 23. Representatives from Midwest Bank, which financed the effort, and members of the Barnesville Lions, which provided the labor, gathered for a photo more than a year after the shed was completed.

Lions member Ken Bauer explained that last year's pandemic disrupted any plans for a formal recognition of the project until this year.

During late summer 2019, volunteers from the Lions Club built the concrete slab for the pre-assembled shed, which they hauled in on a flatbed trailer and secured to the new foundation.

Midwest Bank financed the project with the help of a grant from Partnership for Health. Staff

members from the bank also donate their time doing upkeep for the garden.

Emily Holmes of Midwest Bank said the shed will store several

garden items such as push mowers, a weed whacker, hoses and extra edging for the plots.

The Community Garden, which is sponsored by the Main Street

program, is located east of the city shop on Second Avenue SW. The project was initiated in 2017 with 11 garden plots and has grown in size over the past four years.

The Community Garden's mission is to provide residents the opportunity to grow produce for their own use or for donation to the Barnesville Food Pantry. The Community Garden also promotes volunteerism, education, active

citizenship, the environment, personal and community health as well as sharing experience and knowledge.

Residents can rent a 10' x 10' plot for \$20 for the season, which is May 1 to October 20. Holmes said they

offer a discount of 50 percent off a second plot should a local gardener need more space.

There are still plots available for anyone who wants to enjoy all the benefits of gardening.

Lions Clubs International Foundation – US

In celebration of Lions Clubs International Foundation 50th year they initiated a 3-year campaign to raise US \$300 million to better serve all of the programs under the Lions Clubs International umbrella. Last year, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, LCIF added one year to the campaign. As we enter Campaign 100's final year, fundraising stands at US \$213,293,415 or 71 % of the US\$300 million goal. For the Lions' 2020-2021 year there were 1,200 grants awarded for a total funding of US\$33,549,260.

Our **5M11 District** has done well in 2020-2021 raising US\$29,112.67 in both Minnesota and Manitoba which is an increase of over \$8,000. **Thirty of the 46 Minnesota clubs**, or 65.2% donated something to LCIF during the year for a total of \$13,985. A club must have donated something, anything, to LCIF in order to qualify for the Club Excellence Award. Ten Melvin Jones Fellowships were awarded to Minnesota 5M11 Lions and 3 Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowships were earned.

There were some of interesting things that came out of my study of the statistics regarding Minnesota LCIF contributions during the last year. Firstly, there are **21 Minnesota clubs with enough recorded funds sitting in their accounts to give 33 Melvin Jones Awards immediately**. Many other clubs are near the required \$1,000 to give a MJF Award to some deserving member of their club or community. I will be contacting each club to let them know where there club's account stands.

Another interesting fact is that during the year there were **thirteen 5M11 individuals who donated to LCIF on their own for a total of \$5,660**. Their personal donations can be used to award themselves either a MJF or a PMJF, to give either of those awards to another individual, or to transfer the amount to their club's balance towards an award recipient chosen by the club.

A successful 2021-2022 for Campaign 100 will create even more grant possibilities for Lions service. Remember 100% of your gift goes toward grants and programs for Lions service. It is also tax deductible for the donor. If you, or a member or business of your community wants to be of service by donating to LCIF it can easily be done by credit card, paypal, a pledge donation, check, wire transfer, phone, planned giving options like charitable gift annuities, charitable remainder trusts, memorials, beneficiary designation or endowed gift, matching gifts, stocks, in-kind donations, and shopping with AmazonSmile. - **February 1:** International winners notified on or before this date.


