Greetings Fellow Lions, Lionesses and Leos

Another month has passed and the ability to carry on Lions business continues to be a challenge, maybe even more so than last month. We can only hope and pray this pandemic can end sooner than later.

During the cabinet meeting October 24, the decision was made not to have an in-person mid-winter convention. Instead there will be a one-day virtual meeting on Saturday, January 30, 2021. The details of this are not final but stay tuned as we have some "out of the box" ideas for the meeting.

The Manitoba clubs of the district will soon be involved with the election of an international director (ID). Clubs are currently being asked to name their voting delegates. The actual voting by the delegates will take place January 19-21. The elected director will represent 5M10 Ontario clubs, 5M11 Manitoba clubs and 5M13 clubs. This person will serve as an international director from 2023-2025.

There are two candidates for the ID position; PDG Doug Wiens, 5M11, Grunthal Lions and PDG Joanne Ogden, 5M10, Emo Lions. This is an important election as this area has not had a director for nearly 40 years. The next opportunity will be at least 14 years.

For those of you on the Minnesota side of the border, please consider a date for club visits and submit the club visitation request form. For those of you in Manitoba you can submit a visitation request knowing it will have to be a virtual visit.

Even with the restrictions we are faced with, our work as Lions must continue, in order to better our communities and to help those who are less fortunate than ourselves.

As a "team" we will get through these challenging times and be stronger in the end. Keep up the hope, spirit, and service.

The Hawley, MN Lions Bag up 5,000 pounds of Potatoes

Last Wednesday, the Hawley Lions spent a beautiful fall day bagging potatoes. "Seventeen Lions showed up to bag. The youngest being 32 and the oldest, Lyle Hanson, at 85, though most of us are in our 70s. That life experience adds up to 1,164 years," Lion Member, Joe Pederson, said. The Lions, who are known to crack 4,000 eggs during Breakfast on the Farm, bagged 700 bags of potatoes. If you figure there are about 10 potatoes to a bag, that's 7,000 potatoes. "We estimated that each bag weighs about seven pounds, so we bagged about 5,000 pounds of potatoes, which is quite a few spuds," Joe chuckled.

That is a lot of potatoes to come from a backyard vegetable garden and a few too many for a Thanksgiving dinner, so who supplies the potatoes and where do they go bagged, from Doug Keepings' heated building?

RDO Equipment Co. provided the potatoes. Shawn Nelson is the middle man, who lined things up and assisted in hauling the trailer, supplied by Trevor Muchow, of potatoes to Doug Keeping's farm, where the potatoes were bagged. Ag Valley Supplies supplied the bags and Tony's Supervalu supplied the twisty ties to seal the bags. "All these things have to come together, or the project doesn't work," Joe stated. He went on to say, "It requires a lot of manpower and all those who support us, and we are very grateful for all their help."

The Potato Bagging, which started eleven or twelve years ago, ties together with the MillerCoors Food Drive, now called the Miller Lite Food Drive. Since 2008, the Hawley Liquor Store has collected and donated 80 tons of food and cash (\$1 equals three pounds of food) towards REACH's food pantry. Last year, the Hawley Liquor Store, with the Hawley Lions and community member's help, raised 30,864 pounds of food and cash donations, winning the competition. MillerCoors awards the winning liquor store with a \$1,000 check. Michael Friesen, Manager at the Hawley Liquor Store, donated that \$1,000 along with the food and monetary donations, to the REACH food pantry. "To me, working with the community and helping those in need, especially during the upcoming holidays, is what it is all about," Michael Friesen commented.

The Miller Lite Food Drive kicked off October 1, and the Hawley Liquor Store needs your help in meeting if not beating last year's 30,864 pounds. Food or monetary donations can be made at the Hawley Liquor Store or brought to REACH (due to COVID, you might want to give REACH a jingle, 483-3145, to set up a drop off time) until October 31. "Hopefully, we get that check again this year. That would be another \$1,000 for the food pantry," Michael said.

REACH stocks the food pantry with the potatoes, and they're also used to fill the Spirit of Giving baskets during the holidays. The Lions also donate bags of potatoes to Lakes and Prairies Community Action for their senior program and the Dorothy Day Food Pantry in Moorhead. In past years, bags were donated to area churches for their fall harvest suppers, but COVID-19 canceled such events as the Rollag Lutheran Baked Potato Feed.

"This is a tremendous project, especially this year, with the demand COVID has put on the food pantry. It's a project the Lions look forward to and have fun doing. We should have a tape recorder out there of all the good-natured ribbing back and forth," Joe stated. He went on to say, "We've missed all of our events this year, but we hope to be back in full swing next year because we are here to serve."

Lions that are selected as participants in the Institute must be in good standing in a Lions Club and may not be a 1st Vice District Governor, District Governor, Past District Governor, International Director, or Past International Director.

The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs and additional meals are not included.

However, a \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program.

Participants MUST be available to attend ALL sessions beginning on Thursday evening and ending Sunday afternoon.

Each district has the opportunity to send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions.

The Institute will have a maximum of 72 participants.

Applications are available from your District Governor or on the MD5M Website and are due (without fees) by December 1, 2020.

Your District Governor will then make the final participant selection.

Institute graduates will tell you that the Regional Lions Leadership Institute is beneficial for you in every facet of your life and not just in your role as a Lion.

It's going to be an exciting year for the Lions Foundation this year and we look forward to sharing all the news and updates with you on a regular basis.

The amalgamation of the 2 Foundations and the Hearing committee is going well and is just waiting approval from Canada Charities. This amalgamation will reduce costs for the Foundation, but in no way will affect the services that were provided.

Our Eye Bank commitments will continue as before under the Foundation's Pillar of Sight as will our KidSight program. Our Hearing commitments and vision of the Hearing Committee will continue on through the pillar of Hearing. Medical Assistance Program and Rural Housing programs will continue as they did under the auspices of the Foundation with some new branding and advertising.

Our Rural Housing program will be known as Serenity Suites as all 3 suites available are undergoing a total and complete makeover thanks to the auspices of the Canadian Legacy challenge and all 3 districts contributing \$6500 each and LCIF (Canada) matching those funds dollar for dollar. The first Suite has now been repainted, with new fixtures, cupboards and flooring thanks to 4 members from Emo and District Lions in completing a long weekend of labour to get this done. The suite will have new furniture, bedding, and accessories bringing it into a much more welcoming and homelike atmosphere. We do need your help to complete the work of the first suite as well as move forward on the remaining suites as our bookings will allow. Please contact Tammy if you have the time and the skill to help out.

We have redeveloped our awards program for the Foundation. Please note that all donations should be made to the Lions Foundation but please identify to which program you want the donation to credit. One bank account but your donations will still benefit the program that you wish it to assist. (Sight, Hearing, Medical assistance and Rural Housing). That has not changed.

What has changed is that now your personal or club donations will be recorded in an awards bank and that you will be able to pick and choose the award that your club wishes to present instead of the Foundation automatically sending out an award. We believe that this will be far more meaningful to both the clubs, the donator and the recipient.

We have added the KidSight award to list of honors (\$1000 cumulative donation to the program) as well as the Ben Ward Fellowship. The Ben Ward Fellowship is very similar in nature to the Melvin Jones structure and will also have a progressive acknowledgement as well. (\$1000, \$5000, \$10,000 cumulative dollars) We were honored to have PID Ben award the inaugural 5 recipients of this award at our Strategic planning day prior to our board meeting in September.

We have updated our Strategic plan as well as completed work plans for our Directors to complete over the course of the upcoming year. We have completed many policies and job descriptions that we did not have as well as documented office policy and procedure.
